# **Eligibility Criterion**

- Required Tests
- When applying for admission to Princeton, you must submit official scores for either the SAT Reasoning Test or the ACT (with Writing, where available). All applicants must also take two SAT Subject Tests.

Applicants who intend to pursue a B.S.E. degree should take one SAT Subject Test in either physics or chemistry and one SAT Subject Test in mathematics (Level I or II).

- Score Choice
- Applicants are welcome to use the score choice option for standardized test score submission. Princeton will consider the highest individual section results across all sittings of the SAT Reasoning and the highest composite score for the ACT with Writing, as well as the two highest SAT Subject Test scores. We encourage applicants to submit all official test scores as soon as they are available.
- If possible, we expect students will complete the following courses before beginning study at Princeton:
- four years of English (including continued practice in writing)
- four years of mathematics (including calculus for students interested in engineering)
- four years of one foreign language
- at least two years of laboratory science (including physics and chemistry for students interested in engineering)
- at least two years of history

# **Scholarship**

- ✓ Grant funds: Need-based grants (which are the same as scholarships or "gift aid") are awarded to students from a variety of sources, including University endowments, annual gifts and federal and state programs.
- ✓ Campus employment: Students are offered part-time campus jobs as part of the financial aid award.
- ✓ External scholarships: Students may receive funding from sources outside Princeton, such as the National Merit or local community scholarships. Students apply for these awards separately from their Princeton financial aid application.
